### Call to Order 1.

Chairperson Durkee called the meeting to order at 7:06 p.m.

### 2. **Approval of Minutes**

a. Regular Meeting Minutes of March 18, 2024

M/S/C: Wlodarczyk/McGlone, to approve the March 18, 2024, Recreation Commission Regular Meeting Minutes. Discussion: None. Voice vote, 5-0, all in favor.

Alterations to the Agenda - none 3.

### Public Comment/Guests/Correspondence 4.

Economic Development Commission (EDC) Chairperson Melissa Beers inquired whether the Recreation Commission is interested in continuing its partnership with the Economic Development Commission for the Christmas in July event. This year's event will be held on Saturday, July 13, with a rain date of Sunday, July 14, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Last year's inaugural event was well-attended and very successful. They are seeking assistance with securing food trucks and entertainment and setting up the event. They will also be seeking additional volunteers for assistance. The EDC will be meeting tomorrow at 6:00 p.m. for their regular meeting to further discuss the event.

Chairperson Durkee expressed their experiences from the previous year. Admittedly, EDC Chairperson Beers stated that some unintentional duties overlapped due to the changeover in officers. This year, they are considering forming a subcommittee to help streamline the organization of the event. Commissioner Ahern, who attended the event as a vendor last year, felt that it was well run and looked forward to being on the other side of the event.

Carl Nawrocki, Music Vale Road, invited the Commission to appoint a representative to a newly formed Ad-hoc group, comprised of some of the Town's non-profit organizations. The group was formed to improve the coordination and communication of their events and will include the creation of a community calendar that includes all of the events on the Town website.

The items were added to this evening's Agenda for discussion.

# 5. Budget Report

The Commission reviewed the Budget Report. Any unexpended funds are returned to the Town.

# 6. Recreation Program Coordinator's Report

The Commissioners reviewed the Recreation Program Coordinator's Report.

The Commissioners agreed to rent a porta-potty for the Fun Run event as they were informed that the bathroom at the Old Library may be unable to accommodate the use.

Discussion ensued regarding the scheduling conflicts for the use of the School.

Commissioner McGlone reported that he has found an individual who is interested in hosting a summer Basketball Camp. It was explained that most of the programs are offered at cost to the residents with an additional \$5.00 fee for non-residents. Registrations may be taken by the host and/or the Town. He also proposed hosting a summer Sports Camp for middle school students at Bob Appleby Fields on Forsyth Road.

### 7. Salem Seniors Group Report

Salem Seniors Liaison Commissioner Valentini reported that the recently formed Senior Striders Walking Group meets on Wednesday mornings. This Wednesday, they will be meeting at the Music Vale Road entrance of the Multi-Purpose Path. She encouraged everyone to visit their Facebook Page (facebook.com/groups/1030354251203829/) for updates on all of their events and activities. Salem Resident Judy Gadbois, who will be turning 90 this June, has requested that donations of cereal be made to the Care & Share Food Pantry. Her goal is to have a total donation of 90 boxes. The Group's Annual Potluck Lunch & Talent Show will be held on Saturday, April 26, at 5:00 p.m., at the Gardner Lake Volunteer Fire Company. The Group also continues to host monthly BINGO events on the fourth Thursday of every month. Tickets for the Friday, July 12 Norwich Sea Unicorns Game, which will feature after-game fireworks, are also available. The Group is also offering Senior Chair Yoga Classes on Tuesday evenings and Chair Aerobics Classes on Thursday evenings at Marissa's Dance Academy.

The Red Cross Blood Drive will be held at the Salem Volunteer Fire Company on Thursday, May 16; Monday, July 30, and; October 16.

# 8. ARPA Projects

a. Round Hill Road Bathrooms

The Recreation Program Coordinator will be meeting with the Town Planner to discuss the requirements, if any, for the proposed location of the bathrooms.

Cleaners have been hired to conduct a deep cleaning of the existing bathrooms before Baseball's Opening Day event. Once cleaned, the bathrooms will be reviewed for any work that should be conducted. Salem Little League has agreed to clean the bathrooms throughout the baseball/softball season.

b. Trails & Kiosk/Info Center – Emergency Trail Markers, Harris Brook Trail Signage
The initial trail markings along the Multi-Purpose Path/Harris Brook Trail have been
completed. Commissioner Ahern will arrange a meeting with Salem School CrossCountry Coach Jessica Fletcher to confirm and discuss possible adjustments to the trail.
Following the finalization of the trails and trail markings, Emergency Services will be
requested to review the trail and ensure that their locations are satisfactory and a new
trail map will be produced for the kiosk. Due to safety concerns as hikers would need to
walk alongside Round Hill Road, the proposal to connect the Harris Brook Trail with
the Salem Land Trust's Smuggler's Rock Preserve Blue Trail was abandoned.
Everyone was encouraged to walk the trails, observe the markings, and provide
comments. The trails will be re-reviewed once the vegetation has grown in.

Additionally, a trail connecting an existing trail, located behind the soccer field at Lou Ulffer's Sports Complex, to the Multi-Purpose Path may be proposed.

Chairperson Durkee commended Commissioner Ahern for her hard work and efforts on the trails, to date.

### 9. Unfinished Business

- a. Salem Little League Request for Addition of Baseball/Softball Field
- b. The Commission's discussion regarding the request continued. The skinning of the Babe Ruth field, installing holes for the bases, utilizing temporary fencing, making it adaptable for the various teams, was proposed. The public's use of the open (soccer) field and Little League's desire for an additional field for practices were briefly discussed. The Commission was open to Little League investigating the possibility of installing lights at the fields and an estimate of over \$200,000.00 was received. An email was sent to Salem Little League for their thoughts on the skinning the Babe Ruth field. The question of utilizing funds that is beneficial to only a small portion of the community was also raised.

### h. Memorial Day Parade

The trail for the Memorial Day Search and Find Activity was finalized. Items will be hidden along the trail for participants to find. Those who find a minimum of items will receive a Hoodsie Ice Cream Cup or Popsicle.

Commissioner Valentini has secured the golf cart for the Parade. Ideas for decorating the cart are welcome.

### i. Community Tag Sale

The Spring Community Tag Sale will be held on Saturday, April 27, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Several registrations have been received, to date.

# j. Fun Run Series

Marshall Collins and Joe Dalton have reviewed and revised the course. The exact length of the course will be confirmed and adjustments will be made, as necessary.

### k. Summer Concerts

The Commissioners discussed the select bands for this year's concerts and agreed to check the availability of Hit Play, American Honey, and Alex Shillo. The concert is sponsored, in part, by Sid's Auto Parts.

### 1. Salem Little League Requests

Lighting for current Flagpole
 A request for the lighting for the flagpole was submitted. Its status is unknown.

### 2) No Alcohol/Smoking Signage

Commissioner Wlodarczyk contacted SERAC (Southeastern Regional Action Council) regarding the possibility of adding alcohol to the No Smoking/Vaping signage. No Dogs Allowed signs are already posted at the fields.

### 10. New Business

### a. Disc Golf Clinic

The Disc Golf Clinic will be held on Saturday, May 4, at 10:00 a.m. The vibrantly colored discs that will be distributed to the participants were received.

Discussion ensued regarding the funding for the new beginner tee pads. The Commission approved the funding for the turf for 11 (eleven) tee pads and gravel for the new beginner tee pads allocated in October 2023 and agreed to allocate the funding for the pads.

M/S/C: Crafton/Valentini, to allocate an amount not to exceed \$2,000.00 to purchase turf for the new beginner tee pads. Discussion: None. Voice vote, 6-0, all in favor.

### b. Volleyball Clinic

Chairperson Durkee has reached out to the Salem School Volleyball Coach, who is open to hosting a summer Volleyball Clinic for Grades 4 to 7/8. The Clinic will be held for one week in the Salem School Gymnasium in July. The specifics are to be determined. The possibility of hosting Drop-in Volleyball games at the sand volleyball court at the Pavilion was also proposed.

The boundaries for the sand volleyball court will be installed. The volleyball net is experiencing issues and is in the process of being repaired.

### c. Earth Day

The Earth Day Scavenger Hunt BINGO Cards will be available on Saturday, April 20. The Town is also hosting an Earth Day Cleanup Day; interested residents are asked to come to Town Hall to sign up, provide the road they will be cleaning, and receive a free roll of trash bags. All participants will be entered to win a free compost bin.

d. Round Hill Road Fields (a.k.a. Lou Ulffer's Sports Complex) Updates
Promotional materials will be posted once the Plexiglas is replaced in the kiosk at the
field. The Commissioners were requested to review the Lou Ulffer's Sports Complex
signage to determine whether it should be re-painted.

It was noted that the infield on the tee ball field has been filled with grass. Salem Little League has been consulted and a request may be submitted to Public Works to re-install the infield for next season.

The Commissioners also briefly discussed the condition of the batting cage.

Salem Little League Opening Day will be held on Saturday, April 20, at 10:00 a.m. The event may be moved to the Salem School Gymnasium due to inclement weather.

### e. Christmas in July

The Commissioners discussed and agreed to partner with the EDC for the Christmas in July event. The Commission will also be hosting a booth.

### f. Ad-Hoc Committee

Commissioner Wlodarczyk volunteered to act as the liaison for the Ad-Hoc Committee.

I apologize for the delay in getting this to you. I'm still working on the insurance but I can confirm that we do carry insurance for the league.
