The vendors will be provided a 10' x 10' or 12' x 12' space.

Kathleen Roderick volunteered to secure the signage for the event. The signage and the band will be paid for through either the Commission's operating budget or ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) Funds. The Commission's remaining ARPA funds will be confirmed.

Representative Cheeseman offered a free family membership to the Children's Museum in Niantic as part of the raffle.

The Commissioners agreed to meet with the Recreation Commission at the start of their meeting, which will be held at the Music Vale entrance of the Harris Brook Trail. They will plan to continue their meeting at Town Hall following their meeting with the Recreation Commission.
