1. Call to Order

Chairman Maziarz called the meeting to order at 7:09 p.m.

He expressed his appreciation to the First Selectman's Administrative Assistant for organizing the virtual meeting.

Act on a Motion to Approve the Minutes of February 24, 2020 2.

M/S/C: Natoli/Fresco-Hawes, to approve the Regular Meeting Minutes of February 24, 2020, with the following amendment:

> Item 9(b) Chairman Maziarz will be meeting with the Public Works Director to discuss the possibility of upgrading/repairing the field clay prior to the start of the season. Funds may need to be allocated for any necessary materials in the near future.

Discussion: Chairman Maziarz stated that the upgrading/repairing of the field clay, unbeknownst to him, was completed during the Fall. Voice vote, 6-0, all in favor.

5. Report on the Budget: Alan Maziarz

Chairman Maziarz reported that 24.2% of their budget has been expended. Due to the current state of affairs, all of the programs are currently in limbo and does not expect any big changes in their budget. Any reimbursements that need to be signed off may be e-mailed directly to him or dropped off at his home mailbox.

6. Recreation Program Coordinator's Report: Agnes Miyuki (attached)

Participants are now able to register online and may pay either online or by mail. Should they choose to pay online, a transaction fee will be charged. In response to Chairman Maziarz, the exact percentage amount and the refund process in relation to the transaction fee for any canceled programs will be investigated.

A revised video of the band finalists will be created and distributed for a final vote.

8. Unfinished Business

a. Forsyth Volunteer Field

Both the Forsyth Road Volunteer Field and the Disc Golf projects have been pushed out one year in the Capital Plan due to the current fiscal climate and the pandemic.

b. Disc Golf

Because the Disc Golf project has been pushed out one year in the Capital Plan, Chairman Maziarz proposed the possibility of allocating funds from their budget to install one to two disc golf baskets on the main Pavilion area. Commissioner Bergman suggested contacting Disc Golf Consultant Shawn Callaghan for an estimate. Based on the proposal, Commissioner Natoli estimated that \$2,000.00 for one to two holes would be sufficient.

M/S/C: Natoli/Blezard, to allocate funds not exceed \$2,000.00 for the purpose of starting the Disc Golf course. Discussion: None. Voice vote, 6-1. Voting in Favor: Commissioners Blezard, Durkee, Fletcher, Fresco-Hawes, Natoli, and Maziarz. Voting in Opposition: Commissioner Bergman.

c. Ice Rink – Next Steps

Chairman Maziarz reported that he has spoken with Public Works Director Donald Bourdeau who is agreeable with having his department conduct the excavation and grading of the area for the ice rink.

d. Cooking Class

Chairman Maziarz reported that the East Haddam Parks & Recreation Department is hosting an "On the Rocks Family Cooking Class" via Zoom in May. The registrants would pick up a crate of the ingredients from the restaurant and take part in a live online class to prepare a three-course meal for \$75 for a family of four.

Interim Coordinator Miyuki reported that a total of 32 responses were received from the Facebook Cooking Class Survey with 31 individuals stating their interest in taking a Cooking Class.

Commissioner Natoli suggested the possibility of contacting *Two Brothers Restaurant* and/or *Provider Farms*, who shares recipes weekly and will begin distributing shares in June. Chairman Maziarz will contact Nik and Alex Alevras of *Two Brothers Restaurant* regarding their possible interest.

d. Porta-Potty Quotes

The previous vendor has removed the porta-potties from the fields and *United Rentals* has been contacted for an estimate for the porta-potties.

9. New Business

a. COVID-19 Update

Discussion ensued regarding the need to spray down and sanitize their fields and facilities once they start to open up. Commissioner Natoli questioned whether they should consider installing a hand-washing station(s) and distributing hand sanitizers at their facilities. Chairman Maziarz stated that the hand-washing station(s) could be part of their contract with *United Rental*. Commissioner Blezard suggested checking with the CDC (Center for Disease Control) for any recommendations they might have as well as investigating how our neighboring towns are approaching the subject.

1) Fiscal Planning

Chairman Maziarz, in a recent conversation with the First Selectman, reported the possibility of reducing their funding for fee-based sports, i.e., soccer and baseball, due to the shortened/cancellation of their season(s). Commissioner Bergman stated that reducing their funding could increase the financial stress on the organizations as the cancellation of their season(s) is resulting in the absorption of costs.

b. Salem Field Visits

Chairman Maziarz stated that Commissioner Appleby suggested the possibility of visiting and discussing their fields in the near future. The Commissioners were agreeable to conducting yearly visits to their fields.

c. Chess Club

Commissioner Bergman will investigate the possibility of creating an online Chess Club.

10. Future/New Recreation Endeavors

a. Open Discussions

Medallion Project

Commissioner Natoli reported that the Salem Land Trust is organizing an event for CT Trails Day through iNaturalist and suggested the possibility of continuing with the medallions for CT Trails Day. She proposed distributing 25 to 30 medallions and expanding not only the time frame, but also the locations, including the Pavilion and the Salem Land Trust's newly acquired *Woodland Warbler Preserve*. The Commissioners agreed; Commissioner Natoli will contact *The Red House* regarding the creation of the medallions.

Memorial Day

Commissioner Bergman introduced the possibility of hosting a Commission-sponsored activity to contribute to Memorial Day in lieu of the Memorial Day Bike Decorating Contest. Chairman Maziarz suggested the possibility of inviting residents to decorate their homes and submit a photograph via Facebook or e-mail to the Commission and dividing their submissions into categories. The Commissioners agreed to provide gift certificates of \$25.00 each to *The Plum Tomato*, *Two Brothers Restaurant*, *Salem Valley Ice Cream*, and *Salem Prime Cuts* to the winning decorations. The categories will be: Memorial Day, First Responders, Salem/Cougar Pride, and Anything Goes. Flyers will be distributed via the School's Wednesday Folder and posted on the *Two Brothers Restaurant* Bulletin Board, and an e-blast will be sent out to promote the contest.

M/S/C: Natoli/Bergman, to appropriate \$100.00 for the purchase of gift certificates to local businesses as prize items for the Memorial Day Home Decorating Contest. Discussion: None. Voice vote, 7-0, all in favor.
