Key messages & updates

- As of Wednesday night, 258,267 doses of vaccine had been administered, including 226,930 first doses. Of the total doses administered, 194,203 doses have been administered to healthcare providers at hospitals, clinics, or local health departments and 64,064 doses have been administered to nursing home staff and residents.
- More than 31,000 residents are fully vaccinated, having received both doses of the vaccine
- Our priority and the priority of all of our vaccinators should be focused on scheduling and administering vaccine to the 75+ population. After today, all appointments and clinics should be reserved for the 75+ population until further guidance is issued on the next wave of Phase 1b (65-74)
- The State has prioritized vaccinating those populations most at risk from COVID-19 and this priority should be shared by all of our partners in the vaccine program.
- Anyone who has received a first dose of the vaccine should schedule and receive the second dose – <u>this includes all individuals who were not eligible as either 75+ or Phase</u> <u>1a but received the first dose</u>.
- Until directed by the State or your employer, you are not currently permitted to schedule a vaccine appointment, even if you are eligible within Phase 1b.

- **Patience remains the keyword:** With 1.3 million CT residents in Phase 1b and a limited supply of vaccine from the federal government, it will take time to vaccinate everyone eligible in this phase
- Continue to mask, social distance, practice good hand hygiene, and limit gatherings to the individuals in your own household.
