Children & Family Programs

<u>Draw Your Dreams Story Time:</u> Thursday, July 6, 2023 @ 10:30 a.m. The program will be held outside, weather permitting. The program includes a reading of *The Chalk Garden* and a chalk activity on the sidewalk. Presented by Miss Veronique!

Nature Journaling: Saturday, July 8, 2023 @ 11:00 a.m. Presented by the Denison Pequotsepos Nature Center. Learn about the world around you and engage your creativity with nature journaling! Kids will start their own nature journal with activities such as plant pressing, nature observation, drawing and more. Ages 6+, limited to 30 participants.

<u>Author Story Time:</u> Tuesday, July 18, 2023 @ 10:30 a.m. Author, Deb Adamson, will read from her book, *Bing*, *Bang*, *Pling!* The book is about a young girl helping her mom and dad build a swing set. In simple rhyming verse, children learn the names and sounds of the different tools and what they are used for as each tool has a job to do. Suitable for ages 3-7.

There will be different sessions of 30 minutes each, for a maximum of 20 participants per session When participants come to the event for their 30-minute selected time slot, they will go inside Nile—the life-sized inflatable humpback whale, learn about how whales and humans are similar and different, and have a chance to touch baleen, teeth and bones.
