
SALEM RESIDENT RECEIVES LIONS CLUB'S HIGHEST AWARD

It gives us great pleasure to inform Salem that Gary Closius was selected by the Salem Lions Club as Salem's Humanitarian of the Year for 2023. The Salem Lions recognized his volunteering that supports the Town of Salem.

Gary has served as a leader of youth through Boy Scouts of America and martial arts instructor, teaching valuable life skills to literally hundreds of the area's young people over the last 20+ years. His efforts helped build good citizens and leaders in our communities.

Gary recognized that the area's young women were not as well served; they wanted the opportunity to participate in the same adventures as their brothers. Gary, and others, founded Boy Scouts of America



Venture Crew 123 designed for both young men and woman. Not only has it been a great place for youth to



develop life skills, it also is very much service organization itself with service provided to, for example, CT Special Olympics (annual help with Stonington Regatta), Salem Library (annual help with book fairs), the local cemetery association and Rediscovering History, LLC, (cemetery clean up), Bride Brook Health and Rehabilitation Center (staff appreciation during pandemic, outreach to residents), and even the Salem Unsung Heroes as the Crew helped with multiple banquet preparations. Gary has remained Advisor of Venture Crew 123, even though his own children aged out nearly a decade ago.

Gary has been a tireless volunteer for Care and Share food pantry and regularly makes deliveries to families in need. During the first two years

of the Covid 19 Pandemic, he worked with a small group of citizens delivering food the needy in Salem, when the local United Way suspended their mobile food pantry service to our town.

Gary has been a regular supporter for the annual library book fair, and recently became the president of the Salem Senior Citizen's group. Within four months, the club's population doubled under Gary's leadership and effort.

Gary has been recognized with the J. Michael Leahy Memorial Volunteerism Award for Service to the CT Special Olympics Sailing Regatta. He recently was inducted into the Salem Unsung Heroes for his outstanding volunteerism shown over his lifetime.

The Lions Club District 23C held a banquet dinner on January 22nd at the St. Clements Castle in Portland, CT., to celebrate the selected recipients of the Humanitarian Award from local Lions Clubs.

At the banquet, the district then recognized one of the Humanitarians for outstanding voluntarism. The person is selected at the international level to receive recognition and receive a Melvin Jones Award, the highest honor from the Lions International Club. Gary was recognized for this honor.

If you see Gary Closius around town, take a moment to congratulate him, and thank him for his many unselfish, unpaid efforts for our town.

SNOW REMOVAL

Street safety is the Town of Salem Public Works Department's primary concern during the winter months. Public Works treats the pavement and removes snow whenever road conditions call for these services. Residents should remember that all snow removal operations are performed under emergency conditions. Our drivers work extended hours to ensure safe and effective snow removal. Please help the Public Works Department by following the Snow Emergency Tips and Reminders listed below:

- The Town of Salem has 44 road miles to maintain. Public Works is also responsible for clearing the Town Office, School, Town Library and Transfer Station.
- There are several State controlled roads in Town. Any road that has a route number is a State controlled road. (Routes 82, 85 and 354) The State of CT plows those roads. Please remember that Public Works is not responsible for removing the snow created by plowing past your driveway.
- Please move all vehicles off of the streets or cul-de-sacs during all snow storms that have the possibility of producing at least 3 inches of snow.
- The Town of Salem is not responsible for the snow that accumulates around your mailbox. It is the homeowners' responsibility to remove the accumulated snow from their mailbox.
- Please place your garbage and recycling roll out containers beyond the edge of pavement or curb and NOT in the street. Objects in the street are the biggest deterrent to efficient plowing operations. Remove all basketball backboards from the Town right of way.
- Never pass a snowplow or salt truck.
- If you use a snow blower to clear your driveway, do not blow the snow into the street.
- Never assume the snowplow drivers can see you. Stay at least three (3) car lengths behind the truck. It you cannot see the driver in his mirrors then he cannot see you either.
- If you, or your contractor, use a snow plow to clear your driveway, do not push the snow into the road.


