FLU VACCINATIONS

Flu season is here. The Salem Health Mart Pharmacy can provide Flu and COVID vaccinations at the pharmacy or you can visit your local doctor to determine the right vaccines you may require.

NOTE: you can receive the Flu and the COVID vaccines the same day, however, if you only receive one vaccine you must wait two weeks before receiving either the COVID or the RSV (Respiratory Syncytial Virus) vaccine. Salem Health Mart suggests visiting your personal physician for the RSV vaccines because you have to wait two weeks between it and other vaccines.

Be sure you have your insurance and Medicare Health Insurance cards with you.

ANNUAL MEDICARE OPEN ENROLLMENT SEASON

Just a friendly reminder that the *Annual Medicare Open Enrollment* season has begun and will run from October 15th through December 7th. This is the time of year when you are encouraged to review your insurance plans, and if needed, make changes to your Medicare coverage. This includes Medicare Advantage Plans (Medicare Part C) and Prescription Drug Coverage Plans (Medicare Part D). Medicare can be very confusing to many, not to mention that the mailings and television commercials get added to the mix.

The Colchester Senior Center is holding 2 Open Enrollment Events. I reached out to Patricia Watts the Director/Municipal Agent in Colchester regarding this service and confirmed it is open to Salem Seniors.

They recommend that you schedule an appointment with a Certified CHOICES Counselor, who is trained in all things Medicare, this Open Enrollment season.

Colchester will have 2 Open Enrollment Events. *If you would like to schedule your free and confidential appointment, please call Susan at 860-537-3911.* They will have appointments on Friday, November 17th and December 1st from 9 AM until 2:30 PM. *Be sure to bring a list of the medications you are on.* This will aid in determining the Prescription Drug Coverage Plans (Medicare Part D) best for you. Note any changes which you make to your coverage will take effect on January 1, 2024.

THE CTALERT - EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

Overview:


The State of Connecticut has a state-of-the-art emergency notification system to alert residents about emergencies in your area.

The CTALERT – Emergency Notification System, enables State and Local 911 Emergency Communication Centers to provide essential information quickly in a variety of emergency situations.

How will the CT ALERT - Emergency Notification System Work?

- The process begins when the State of Connecticut or your Local 911 Emergency Communication Centers issues a message about a potential safety hazard or concern. Messages will be sent to all standard voice and text communication devices, including land line phones, mobile phones, e-mail, and more.
- If you don't confirm receipt of the message, the system may try to reach your second contact number or email address if the message is critical and requires your confirmation.
- Voice calls from CTAlert will come from (860) 920-3337. Save this number as an emergency contact.
- Text message may come from 88911, 888777, 89361 or 87844. All of these are text message short codes you can also save as a contact and identify with a unique ring or alert.

FOOD DATE LABELS AND UNDEERSTANDING THEIR MEANING

IS THIS FOOD EXPIRED?

UNDERSTANDING DATE LABELS

The dates that food companies put on packages are not regulated and do not mean that the food is unsafe to eat, except in the case of baby formula. Most foods are still tasty and nutritious after the date has passed. Not sure if food is spoiled? Check for off odor, flavor or texture.

"BEST BY" OR "BEST IF USED BY" DATE

This date tells you when the food will have the **best flavor**. It is **still safe to eat** past this date.

"USE BY" OR "EXPIRATION" DATE

This is the last date that the product will be at its **peak quality**. It is **still safe to eat** past this date (**except for baby formula**).

"PACKING/MANUFACTURING" DATE

This is the date used by manufacturers for tracking.

It is not an expiration date - it is not related to food quality or safety.

"SELL BY" DATE

This tells the store how long to display the product for sale.

It is **still safe to eat** past this date.

GOOD FOR UP TO ONE YEAR AFTER THE DATE:

- Packaged food like cereal, pasta, dried beans, and baking mixes
- Frozen foods
- · Canned goods including soup, condiments, meat, fruit, and vegetables

GOOD FOR UP TO 30 DAYS AFTER THE DATE:

- Butter
- Cheese
- Eggs

GOOD FOR UP TO SEVEN DAYS AFTER THE DATE:

- Milk
- Yogurt
- · Cream Cheese




