RESIDENT RAY EVANS MAKES HIS FATHER'S DREAM COME TRUE

THE SALEM HISTORICAL SOCIETY IS SUPPORTIVE

Former New York Jets Football player and longtime Salem resident Ray Evans is working to make his father's dream come true by quarterbacking the restoration of his father's old school, the Pleasant Grove School, located in the lumber town of Alcolu, South Carolina.

In 1933, Pleasant Grove School was established as the first public school building for African-American students in the Clarendon County School District. When the school closed in 1953 as a result of the South Carolina equalization





program, there were five teachers and 159 students attending the school. Sadly, the building fell into despair until Ray's father, Joe Louis Evans told Ray of his dream to restore the historical old school that he attended as a child.

Ray, a former Tight End for the New York Jets in the 1980s, recently retired as a School Resource Officer at Norwich Free Academy and was eager to take the ball and run with it to make his dad proud.

Ray said he has been traveling back and forth from Salem to South Carolina to work on this project and said he could not think of a better way to honor his father's legacy than to bring the school back to life for generations to come.

Salem Historical Society President and former Town Selectman Elby Burr said "I have a great deal of experience in building projects and the Society will be monitoring this project and offering support and advice. Some of our members have already donated to this project. We would like to have Ray facilitate a presentation at our newly updated multimedia-capable Historical Society Museum to keep us all updated on his progress."

The Pleasant Grove School Restoration Committee will be working on the school and is passionate about the preservation and protection of the historical, cultural, and agricultural heritage. The Committee has been in touch with the African-American Settlement Historical Commission, Mt. Pleasant, South Carolina, as well as the New London County Historical Society.

New Salem Lions Vo-Ed Grant

Further information regarding the Grant application will be sent to the Salem School. This will now be an annual grant.

Again this year the Salem Lions Club will be awarding up to two \$2,000.00 Scholarships to a 2023 High School graduate including home school graduates and Vo-Tech Schools graduates residing in Salem. Information regarding these scholarships is available in the Salem School District office.

SERVICES AVAILABLE TO SENIORS

<u>Municipal Medical Transportation Service</u> – This grant funded service is processed through Eastern Connecticut Transportation Consortium, Inc. Salem residents are eligible to receive free transportation for medical appointments within New London County. Due to high demand and limited funding, the program has been reduced to 24 (twenty-four) rides one-way. A registration form must be completed and submitted to qualify. Reservations must be made no later than 48 hours and up to two (2) weeks ahead. TVCCA (Thames Valley Council for Community Action, Inc.) – A non-profit organization providing such services as Energy Assistance, Employment Assistance, Senior Programs, Housing Assistance, Financial Services, Education, and Family Support. 

Salem Recreation is happy to report that the Disc Golf Committee has begun working on the updates to the revised Disc Golf Course.

The proposed updates to the course were presented to, reviewed by, and approved and/or received the support of all of the town's relevant departments, boards, and commissions, including the Inland Wetlands & Conservation Commission Planning & Zoning Commission, where they received a Favorable §8-24 Review, and the Board of Selectmen. They have also consulted with our town's risk management agency, CIRMA (Connecticut Interlocal Risk Management Agency).

The revised course will be comprised of 18 holes and three (3) crossings. Beginning and ending at soon-to-be-dedicated Bob Appleby Fields at Volunteer Park on Forsyth Road, it will loop around behind the corn fields, away from the Pavilion area at Salem Community Park. The course will be slightly longer with an estimated difficulty level of 5 or 6 on a scale of 1 to 10, 10 being an extreme course. A kiosk will be installed at the start of the course and will include a map, emergency information, rules, and a QR code linking players to the information. Signage will also be placed at each hole and at trail crossings indicating the player's location.

The Disc Golf Course Committee has provided site walks of the proposed revised course to the Recreation Commission and the town's Emergency Services and Public Works Departments. Their suggestions and recommendations to ensure the safety of hikers and disc golfers and to provide adequate access to all of the holes for our Emergency Services Departments to help any injured parties will be instituted. A final site walk will be held to confirm and further ensure the safety of the course.

While the process has taken some time, it is our ultimate goal to provide a fun and safe activity for the young and the old members of our community.

Special thanks to Rob LeMire, the Disc Golf Committee, and all of the involved parties for their dedication, diligence, hard work, and efforts and for taking the time to work with us to bring the course to fruition — we couldn't do it without you!

We hope you will all join us as we look forward to re-opening the course during the late spring/early summer.







